

Greene County Impact Report Narratives for Fiscal Year 2023-2024

Each local government that receives opioid settlement funds is asked to share an Annual Settlement Update describing how they have made use of settlement funds during each fiscal year. For each strategy funded, local governments also share additional narratives to describe their progress and successes (success information is optional for some local governments). Across all funded strategies, each local government selects one progress narrative and one success narrative to spotlight each fiscal year.

Greene County provided the following information for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 (July 2023 through June 2024):

Annual Settlement Update

Greene County is collaborating with Lenoir County in a regional model that will manage the funds through a non-profit organization , Recovery Together. The operation of Recovery Together will be outlined in more detail within a memorandum of understanding (MOU), approved by each county commission. The organization will provide services that mitigate the impacts of opioid addiction including: prevention, education, early (childhood) intervention, accountability, and connecting individuals to court-run programs intended to provide alternatives to incarceration and reduction of removal of children from their families.

Recovery Together will be run as a non-profit. The executive board will be comprised of the following individuals (at minimum):

- County Commissioner Chairperson from each county
- County Health Director
- Chief District Court Judge
- County Social Services Director
- County Sheriff
- Community College Representatives
- Public School Representatives
- At-large member(s)

Greene County did not disburse funds for any strategies in F.Y. 2023-2024.
