

North Carolina is set to receive **\$1.6 billion** from the national opioid settlements, with **85%** of these funds going directly to local governments. Before spending any opioid settlement dollars, local governments must approve and share spending plans with details on strategies they intend to fund. **Exhibit A strategies** are high-impact strategies that address the opioid overdose epidemic. **Exhibit B strategies** are from the national settlement agreements and are available once a local government first engages in a **Collaborative Strategic Planning process**. Local governments must report annually to CORE-NC on opioid settlement funds received and spent, along with the impact of those funds. Below is a summary for this community.

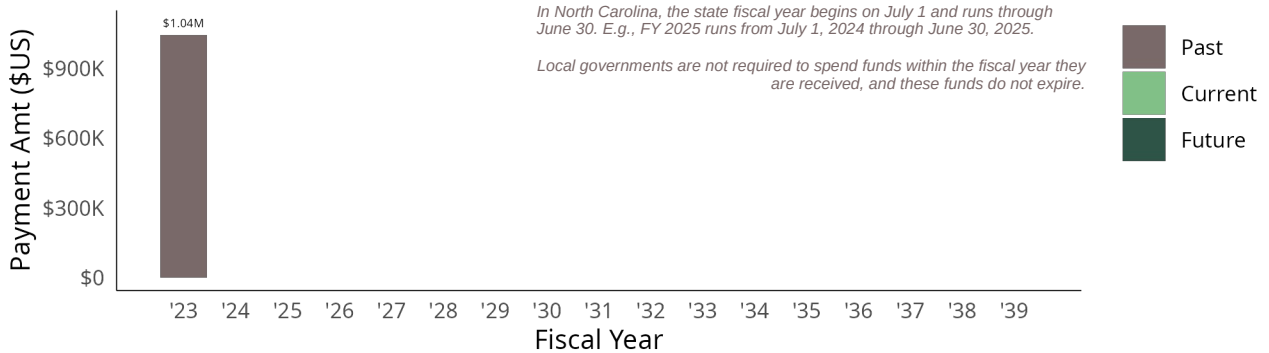

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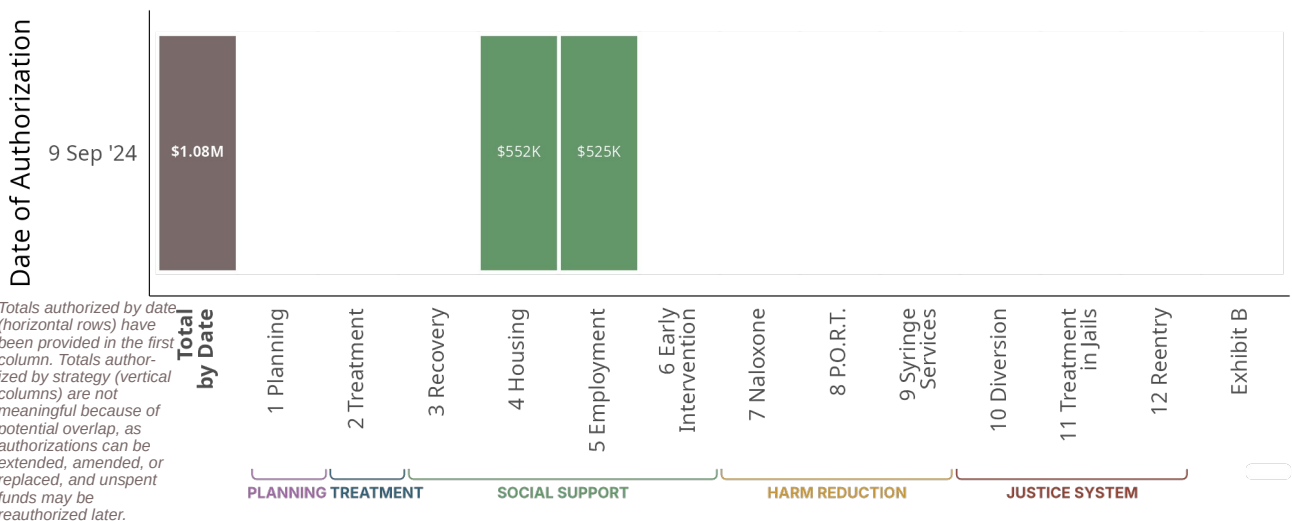
PAYMENTS

City of Charlotte is set to receive approximately **\$0** in opioid settlement funds from 2022 through 2038. They have already received the full **\$0**.



SPENDING PLANS

City of Charlotte has approved and shared **one** spending plan authorizing **2** unique strategies as of June 15, 2026.



Totals authorized by date (horizontal rows) have been provided in the first column. Totals authorized by strategy (vertical columns) are not meaningful because of potential overlap, as authorizations can be extended, amended, or replaced, and unspent funds may be reauthorized later.

Local governments must approve and share **spending plans** before spending opioid settlement funds. Local governments may not spend more than they have approved, though they may spend less.

TOP LOCAL STRATEGIES

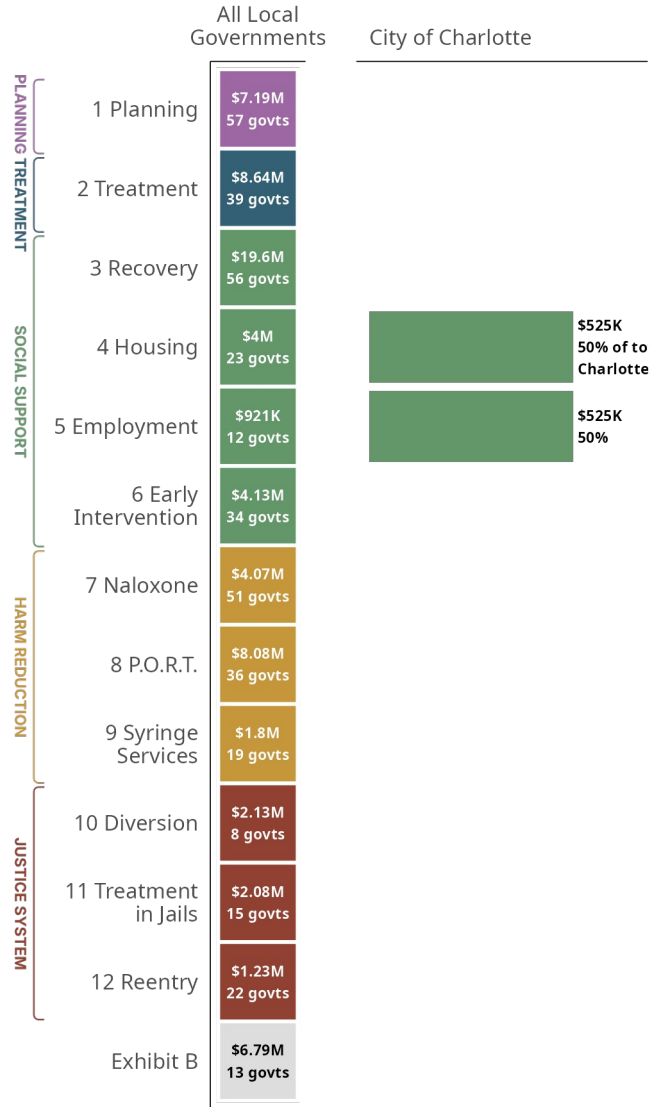
City of Charlotte's most-funded strategies are:

- **Recovery Housing Support: \$525K.**
- **Employment-related Services: \$525K.**

TOP LOCAL STRATEGIES
ACROSS NORTH CAROLINA

Local governments in **North Carolina** have collectively spent **\$70.7M**; the three most locally-funded strategies across North Carolina are:

- **Recovery Support Services: 56** governments have spent a total of **\$19.6M.**
- **Evidence-Based Addiction Treatment: 39** governments have spent a total of **\$8.64M.**
- **Post-Overdose Response Team: 36** governments have spent a total of **\$8.08M.**
